GENERAL PROVISIONS

Sec. 97.01. Title.

This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the Parks and Recreation Chapter of the city.

Sec. 97.02. Definitions.

For the purpose of this chapter the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

Department. The Department of Public Works of the city.

Director. The Director of Public Works of the city, or his duly authorized agent or assistant.

Park. Any of the public parks located in the City as defined by City Council resolution for acceptance as a park and owned or operated by the City under the jurisdiction and control of the Department, including, but not limited to, non-motorized trailways and/or any public trailway system. The following has been recognized as city public parks: Riverview Park, Mutton Park, Waterworks Park, Eastview Veterans Memorial Park, River Road Park, Cornwell Park, Somerset Park, and Flushing Riverview Trail.

Public Building. Any park or recreation building.

Superintendent. The Superintendent of Public Works of the city, or his duly authorized agent or assistant.

Sec. 97.03. Violation of rules and regulations prohibited.

No person shall violate any duly adopted rule or regulation governing conduct in any city park.

Sec. 97.04. Application.

The rules and regulations contained in this Chapter shall apply to all City parks, recreation areas, and non-motorized trailways.

Sec. 97.05. Park hours.

The Director shall designate the hours during which the parks shall be open to the public. The opening and closing hours for each individual park shall be posted therein for public information.

Sec. 97.06. Closed areas.

Any section or part of any park may be declared closed to the public by the Director at any time and for any interval of time, either temporarily or at regular and stated intervals, daily or otherwise, and either entirely or merely to certain uses, as the Director shall find reasonably necessary.

Sec. 97.07. Permit for group activities.

- (a) Whenever any group, association, or organization desires to use park facilities for a particular purpose, such as picnics, parties, or theatrical or entertainment performances, or for civic activities, a representative of the group, association, or organization shall first obtain a permit from the City Council for such purpose. (Code 1967, § 3-729)
- (b) The City Council shall issue a permit when they find that:
 - (1) The proposed activity or use of the park will not unreasonably interfere with or detract from the general public enjoyment of the park;
 - (2) The proposed activity and use will not unreasonably interfere with or detract from the promotion of public health, welfare, safety, and recreation;

- (3) The proposed activity or use is not reasonably anticipated to incite violence, crime, or disorderly conduct;
- (4) The proposed activity will not entail unusual, extraordinary, or burdensome expense or police operation by the city; and
- (5) The facilities desired have not been reserved for other use at the days and hours requested in the application.

- (c) The person to whom a permit is issued shall be liable for any loss, damage, or injury sustained by any person whatever by reason of the negligence of the person to whom such a permit shall have been issued. (Code 1967, § 3-731)
- (d) The Director shall have the authority to revoke a permit upon a finding of violation of any rule or ordinance, or upon good cause shown. (Code 1967, § 3-732) (Ord. passed 7-14-86) Penalty, see § 10.99

Sec. 97.08. Alcoholic beverages; Drunkenness.

- (a) No person shall consume or have in their possession any alcoholic beverages, nor any open alcoholic beverages contained in motorized vehicles whether stopped, parked, standing, or moving, except as provided in subsection (c) herein. (Ord. No. 97, 10-24-05)
- (b) No person shall consume or have in their possession in any public building any alcoholic beverages; except, that this provision shall not apply to the Veterans Memorial Hall when it is licensed for use by others and then only when the consumption of alcohol therein is authorized by a specific city license.

(c) At certain specifically designated recreation centers, including fenced areas of public property, served under concession privileges by a duly authorized civic non-profit organization, the sale of beer or wine by a concessionaire shall be permitted by license of the City of Flushing and under the strict regulation and control of the Flushing Chief of Police. Sales of beer or wine shall be made only in individual drinks, not in original packages or otherwise in bulk, and shall be served for consumption only in the immediate premises or fenced area of the concession, and in accordance with rules of use policies adopted by the Flushing City Council.

(d) No person shall enter any park under the influence of intoxicating beverages, or be under the influence of intoxicating beverages while in any park. (Code 1967, § 3-754) (Ord. passed 7-14-86) Penalty, see § 10.99.

Sec. 97.09. Drugs.

No person shall:

- (a) Have, possess, use, take, or administer any drugs or controlled substances as defined in Act 196 of the Public Acts of 1971, as amended. (Code 1967, § 3-755)
- (b) Enter any park while under the influence of any drugs or controlled substances as defined in division (a) above, or be under the influence of any such drugs or controlled substances while in any park. (Code 1967, § 3-756) (Ord. passed 7-14-86) Penalty, see § 10.99.

Sec. 97.11. Domestic animals restricted.

(a) No dogs or other domestic animals shall be allowed unless the animal shall be restrained on a leash not greater than six feet in length, except service dogs which are in the immediate vicinity and under the control by voice or hand control or other alternate control by a qualified individual with a disability where such dog poses no danger to the public.

(b) All persons bringing domestic animals to the park shall be responsible to clean up after the animal.

(c) Any person bringing a dog or other domestic animal to a park shall be responsible to insure that the animal does not make unreasonable noise so as to interfere with the peace and quiet of other persons using the park.

§ 97.11 FLUSHING CODE – PARKS AND RECREATION

(d) No farm animals, including horses, cattle, sheep, goats, swine or other livestock or similar animals and other exotic animals shall be allowed within city parks, recreation areas or trailways.

Sec. 97.12. Fires.

No person shall build or attempt to build a fire except in those areas and under such regulations as may be designated by the Director. No person shall drop, throw, or otherwise scatter lighted matches, burning cigarettes or cigars, tobacco paper, or other flammable material within any park area or on any highway, road, or street abutting or contiguous thereto. (Code 1967, § 3-759) (Ord. passed 7-14-86) Penalty, see § 10.99.

Sec. 97.13. Games of chance prohibited.

No person shall gamble or otherwise participate in or abet any game of chance. (Code 1967, § 3-760) (Ord. passed 7-14-86) Penalty, see § 10.99.

Sec. 97.14. Loitering and disorderly conduct.

No person shall sleep or protractedly lounge on the seats or benches or other areas, or engage in loud, boisterous, threatening, abusive, insulting, or indecent language, or engage in any disorderly conduct or behavior tending to a breach of the public peace. (Code 1967, § 3-761) (Ord. passed 7-14-86) Penalty, see § 10.99.

Sec. 97.15. Interfering with park users.

No person shall disturb or interfere unreasonably with any person or party occupying any area, or participate in any such activity in a park. (Code 1967, § 3-762) (Ord. passed 7-14-86) Penalty, see § 10.99.

Sec. 97.16. Vending and peddling.

No person shall expose or offer for sale any article or thing, or operate or place any stand, cart, or vehicle for the transportation, sale, or display of any such article or thing. Exception is made as to any regularly licensed concessionaire acting by and under the authority and regulation of the Director.

Sec. 97.17. Posting signs prohibited.

No person shall paste, glue, tack, or otherwise post any sign, placard, advertisement, or inscription whatever, nor shall any person erect or cause to be erected any sign whatever in any part of any public lands, highways, or roads adjacent to a park.

§ 97.32

PARK PROPERTY

Sec. 97.30. Buildings and facilities.

No person shall:

- (a) Willfully mark, deface, disfigure, injure, tamper with, displace, or remove any buildings, bridges, tables, benches, fireplaces, railings, paintings or painting materials, public utilities or appurtenances, signs, notices, or placards, whether temporary or permanent, or other structures or equipment, facilities or park property or appurtenances whatsoever, either real or personal;
- (b) Fail to cooperate in maintaining restrooms and washrooms in a neat and sanitary condition. No person over the age of five years shall use the restrooms and washrooms designated for the opposite sex; or
- (c) Dig or remove any trees, shrubs, or plants. (Code 1967, § 3-735) (Ord. passed 7-14-86) Penalty, see § 10.99.

Sec. 97.31. Trees, shrubbery, and vegetation.

No person shall:

- (a) Damage, cut, carve, transplant, or remove any tree or plant or injure the bark, or pick the flowers or seeds, of any tree or plant, nor attach any rope, wire, or other contrivance to any tree or plant. A person shall not dig in or otherwise disturb grass areas, or in any other way injure or impair the natural beauty or usefulness of any area.
- (b) Climb any tree, or walk, stand, or sit upon monuments, vases, fountains, railings, fences, or upon any other property not designated or customarily used for these purposes.

Sec. 97.32. Wild animals and birds.

No person shall:

(a) Hunt, molest, harm, frighten, kill, tramp, chase, tease, shoot, or throw missiles at any animal, reptile, or bird, nor remove or have in his possession the young of any wild animal, or the eggs or nest, or young of any reptile or bird, nor shall he collect, remove, have in his possession, give away, sell or offer to sell, buy or offer to buy, or accept as a gift any specimen, whether alive or dead, of any of the group of tree snails. Exception to this division (a) is made in that snakes known to be deadly poisonous, such as rattlesnakes, moccasins, coral snakes, or other deadly reptiles, may be killed on sight.

(b) Give or offer, or attempt to give to any animal or bird any tobacco, alcohol, or other known noxious substances.

SANITATION

Sec. 97.40. Pollution of waters.

No person shall throw, discharge, or otherwise place or cause to be placed in the waters of any fountain, pond, lake, stream, or other body of water in or adjacent to any park or any tributary, stream, storm sewer, or drain flowing into such waters, any substance, matter, or thing, whether liquid or solid, which will or may result in the pollution of the waters.

Sec. 97.52. Refuse and trash.

No person shall bring in or dump, deposit, or leave any bottles, broken glass, ashes, paper, boxes, cans, dirt, rubbish, waste, garbage, or refuse, or other trash. No refuse or trash shall be placed in any waters in or contiguous to any park, or left anywhere on the grounds thereof, but shall be placed in the proper receptacles where these are provided. Where receptacles are not so provided, all rubbish or waste shall be carried away from the park by the person responsible for its presence, and properly disposed of elsewhere. (Code 1967, § 3-739) (Ord. passed 7-14-86) Penalty, see § 10.99.

VEHICLES AND BICYCLES

Sec. 97.50. Compliance with traffic laws.

No person shall fail to comply with all applicable provisions of the state and city motor vehicle traffic laws in regard to equipment and operation of vehicles together with those regulations as are contained in this and other regulations.

Sec. 97.51. Obedience to traffic directions by authorized personnel.

No person shall fail to obey all traffic officers and park employees, such persons being hereby authorized and instructed to direct traffic whenever and wherever needed in the parks and on the highways, streets, or roads immediately adjacent thereto in accordance with the provisions of these regulations and such supplementary regulations as may be issued subsequently by the Director.

GENERAL REGULATIONS – PARKS AND RECREATION § 97.56

Sec. 97.52. Driving in parking lots.

No person shall drive any motor vehicle or motorcycle, or knowingly permit the same to be operated in any parking lot or parking area owned, operated, or controlled by the city, unless the driver is immediately undertaking to leave the parking lot or area after having been lawfully parked. No person shall use such a parking lot or area as a shortcut, an area to learn driving, or an area in which to meet or congregate.

Sec. 97.53. Traffic signs.

No person shall fail to observe carefully all traffic signs indicating speed, direction, caution, stopping, or parking, and all others posted for proper control and to safeguard life and property.

Sec. 97.54. Speed restrictions.

No person shall ride or drive a vehicle at a rate of speed exceeding ten miles per hour, except upon those roads as the Director may designate, by posted signs, for speedier travel. (Code 1967, § 3-744) (Ord. passed 7-14-86) Penalty, see § 10.99.

Sec. 97.55. Vehicles confined to roadways.

No person shall drive any vehicle on any area except the paved park roads or parking area, or those other areas as may on occasion be specifically designated as temporary parking areas by the Director of Public Works.

The operation of a motor driven vehicle of any kind, except for battery operated wheelchairs and handicapped devices such as Amigos, is prohibited on public trailways designated as non-motorized trailways. Except as herein provided, motor driven vehicles include, but are not limited to motor driven sleds, toboggans, snowmobiles, or any other motor or battery driven device, including motor driven bicycles. (Ord. No. 97, 10-24-05)

Sec. 97.56. Muffler required.

No person shall fail to use a muffler adequate to deaden the sound of the engine in a motor vehicle.

§ 97.57 FLUSHING CODE – PARKS AND RECREATION

Sec. 97.57. Parking regulations.

(a) No person shall park a vehicle in other than an established or designated parking area, and such use shall be in accordance with the posted directions there at and with the instructions of any attendant who may be present.

- (b) Stopping or parking on the left-hand side of any road or parkway is prohibited.
- (c) No person shall leave any vehicle anywhere in a park with motor set in gear and doors locked, or in any manner fixed or arranged so that the vehicle cannot readily be moved by hand.
- (d) No person shall leave a vehicle standing or parked at night without lights clearly visible for at least one hundred (100) feet from both the front and rear on any driveway or road area except in legally established parking areas.
- (e) No person shall fail to immediately notify an attendant of an emergency in the nature of a breakdown requiring the assistance of a tow truck, mechanic, or other person.
- (f) Double parking any vehicle on any road or parkway directed by a park official is prohibited.

Sec. 97.58. Bicycles.

No person shall:

- (a) Ride a bicycle on other than a paved vehicular road or path designated for that purpose. A bicyclist shall be permitted to wheel or push a bicycle by hand over any grassy area or wooded trail or any paved area reserved for pedestrian use.
- (b) Ride a bicycle other than on the right-hand side of the road paving as close as conditions permit, and bicycles shall be kept in single file when two (2) or more are operating as a group. Bicycles shall at all times be operated with reasonable regard to the safety of others, signaling all turns, passing to the right of any vehicle going in the opposite direction or passing to the left of any vehicle going in the same direction; all bicycles passing pedestrians shall pass safely, with an audible signal to all pedestrians upon the road, parking area or trailway.

- (c) Ride any other person on a bicycle.
- (d) Leave a bicycle in a place other than a bicycle rack when such is provided and there is space available.

GENERAL REGULATIONS – PARKS AND RECREATION \$97.68

- (e) Leave a bicycle lying on the ground or paving, or set against trees, or in any place or position where other persons may trip over or be injured by them.
- (f) Ride a bicycle on any road at any time between thirty (30) minutes after sunset and thirty (30) minutes before sunrise without an attached headlight plainly visible at least

one hundred (100) feet in front of and without a red taillight or red reflector plainly visible from at least fifty (50) feet from the rear of the bicycle.

RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES

Sec. 97.65. Hunting; use of firearms and other weapons.

- (a) No person shall hunt, trap or pursue wildlife at any time.
- (b) No person shall use, carry, or possess firearms of any description, or air-rifles, spring-guns, bow and arrows, slings, or any other forms of weapons potentially inimical to wildlife and dangerous to human safety, or any instrument that can be loaded with and fire blank cartridges, or any kind of trapping device.
- (c) Shooting into park areas from beyond park boundaries is forbidden. (Code 1967, § 3-749) (Ord. passed 7-14-86)

Sec. 97.66. Use of picnic areas.

No person shall picnic or lunch in a place other than those designated for that purpose. Attendants shall have the authority to regulate the activities in these areas when necessary to prevent congestion and to secure the maximum use for the comfort and convenience of all. Visitors shall comply with any directions given to achieve this end. (Code 1967, § 3-750) (Ord. passed 7-14-86)

Sec. 97.67. Camping; permit required.

No person shall camp in a city park without first obtaining a permit therefore. (Code 1967, § 3-751) (Ord. passed 7-14-86)

Sec. 97.68. Games restricted to designated areas.

No person shall take part in or abet the playing of any games involving thrown or otherwise propelled objects such as balls, stones, arrows, javelins, or model airplanes except in areas set apart for these forms of recreation. The playing of rough or comparatively dangerous games such as football, baseball, and quoits is prohibited except on the fields and courts or areas provided therefore. Rollerskating shall be confined to those areas specifically designated for this pastime.

§97.75 FLUSHING CODE – PARKS AND RECREATION

AUTHORITY AND ENFORCEMENT

Sec. 97.75. Citizens advisory committees.

- (a) *Purpose*. The purpose of this ordinance is to recognize the important role of individual citizens in reviewing and evaluating the needs of the City with the shared goal of improving the general welfare of the City of Flushing. To that end, the City of Flushing shall create the following advisory committees and appoint members thereto who shall act in an evaluation and advisory capacity to the City Council.
- (b) *Committees*. The following committees are hereby created:
 - (1) Parks and Recreation Committee. This committee shall evaluate and make recommendations to the City Council concerning parks and recreational needs, as well as suggestions for the beautification and betterment of the city and its environment. It may also consider cooperative efforts in these matters with adjoining townships and municipalities or other city committees. It may recommend changes or improvements to facilities, rules and regulations for the use thereof and recommend budgetary needs for such purposes. It may implement such recommendations as are approved by the City Council in conjunction with and at the direction of the Director of the Department of Public Works.

- (2) Youth Council. The Youth Council shall evaluate and make recommendations to the Flushing City Council so as to involve youth in community decision-making. Students will explore youth issues (including, but not limited to, school, community, health, and a broad range of youth activities and issues) community actions and identify techniques to engage youth in community development. (Ord. No. 97, 2-9-04)
- (3) S.A.L.T. Committee (Seniors and Law Enforcement Together). This committee shall work with and at the direction of the City Police Department to improve public relations and communications within the community to improve public safety under the auspices of the City Council.

(c) Membership.

(1) Except for the Youth Council, Committee memberships shall consist of up to seven (7) persons, chosen by the City Council for three-year terms; membership shall be limited to those residents meeting the qualifications for holding elective city office.

GENERAL REGULATIONS – PARKS AND RECREATION

§97.75

The Youth Council shall consist of two components:

(a) Students from either or both the High School and Junior High School levels - whether public or parochial - shall be selected by the mentors, in subsection (b), upon application. Students from the various schools shall be selected

based on their interest in activities in and around the City of Flushing and having either residence in the City of Flushing or in the surrounding Townships. The teens so chosen shall be responsible for developing an organizational structure, bylaws, budgets, and determining the issues they wish to address or the activities they wish to engage in including the development of the Council to accomplish those goals;

- (b) Three (3) appointed mentors shall be selected by the City Council. These persons shall mentor to the students, guiding them during their business meetings and will act as facilitators to help the Youth Council achieve its goals where acting in a guidance role. Mentor shall serve a three-year term being appointed as provided in subsection (c)(2) through (6) of this Ordinance; and
- (c) The Youth Council students and the mentors shall each report to the City Council at least annually. (Ord. No. 97, 2-9-04)
- (2) All persons shall serve at the pleasure of the City Council and may be appointed or removed in the discretion of the City Council. Vacancies shall be filled by the City Council.
- (3) Members of the committees shall be appointed so that in its initial membership, members shall serve one (1), two (2) or three (3) years and thereafter, on the expiration of that term, to three-year terms. Vacancies shall be filled for the remainder of the existing term of the person vacating the office. Should the appointment or reappointment of committee members be delayed, sitting committee members shall continue in office until their successors are appointed. (Ord. No. 97, 2-9-04)
- (4) Membership shall be based on a diversity of interest, experience, and expertise.
- (5) The committee appointed by the City Council may, in its discretion, name additional members to the committee as ex officio members to add greater diversity and/or expertise and to further the work of the committee.
- (6) The committee may annually vote, in December, to recommend persons for appointment to their committee by City Council, to fill those positions expiring the next January or at any time where a vacancy is created prior to January.

§97.75 FLUSHING CODE – PARKS AND RECREATION

(d) Organization.

(1) *Officers*. Committees shall select a chairperson, vice-chairperson and secretary, as well as such other officers as may be deemed necessary by the committee.

- (2) *Bylaws*. Committees shall create bylaws setting forth methods of procedure and operation and duties of officers, etc. These bylaws shall be approved by City Council, consistent with this ordinance and the charter and ordinances of the City of Flushing. Although each committee may act informally, it may also adopt specific rules of order if deemed necessary for its operations.
- (3) Subcommittees. Committees may create subcommittees, which may include persons outside the appointed committee. Persons living in adjacent townships or municipalities may be appointed to such subcommittees as deemed necessary where matters of common concern or interest are found.

(4) Meetings.

- a. Regular quarterly meetings shall be established except where determined otherwise for lack of business, vacations, etc. Such meetings shall be posted in accordance with the Open Meetings Act and published annually. Special meetings may be called by the chair or two (2) committee members as necessary with seven (7) days notice and posting at the City Hall.
- b. The committee shall determine the manner in which such meetings are conducted. Public comment is encouraged as well as public participation through subcommittees. A majority of the members appointed shall constitute a quorum for any meeting.
- c. Meetings shall be held at the City Hall or such other designated locations within the city.
- d. Minutes shall be kept of each meeting or special meeting by the committee secretary and copies shall be filed with the city clerk/treasurer.

(e) Budget.

- (1) Each committee may request funds from the City Council for its operational expenses and approved projects.
- (2) The committee shall prepare a proposed budget including proposed expenditures. The proposed budget shall be submitted to the City Clerk/Treasurer by February 1 of each year.

§97.75 FLUSHING CODE – PARKS AND RECREATION

(3) The City Council may allocate such monies as it deems necessary for the committee as set forth in the proposed budget, with specific expenditures approved as set forth in the City Council budget. All expenditures are to be made in accordance with the City's Purchasing Ordinance. All funds allocated to the

committee shall be held by the City Clerk/Treasurer and drawn from such city funds on request of the committee to the City Clerk/Treasurer.

(f) Reports.

- (1) Committee chairs shall prepare a report directly to the City Council at least semiannually, setting forth the activities it has conducted, the meetings it has held, its recommendations and future plans.
- (2) City Council, where possible, shall refer matters to the Committees as needed for evaluation and recommendation within the area of responsibility of each committee.

(g) Property.

- (1) All property purchased shall be owned by the City of Flushing and shall be stored in accordance with the city policies and procedures in city storage facilities. The committee shall comply with the city ordinance regarding the purchase and sale of personal property, being Sec. 36.20 to 36.25 of the city ordinances.
- (2) A list of all such property shall be furnished to the City Clerk/Treasurer upon receipt of the property and shall be stored on city property in an area approved by the City Manager.

Sec. 97.76. Operation and maintenance of parks.

- (a) All parks in the city shall be operated and maintained under the supervision of the department of public works.
- (b) The director shall be responsible for the operation and maintenance of the city parks and all employees of the department concerned in the maintenance of such parks shall perform their duties under the supervision of the director.

The director of Public Works, with the assistance of any duly designated police officer, shall enforce the provisions of this chapter and any other ordinances pertaining to city parks, recreation areas and non-motorized trailways and shall enforce all rules and regulations relating to the use of the parks. Violation of the Park and Recreation Rules and Regulations shall be a civil infraction enforced under Chapter 11 of the City of Flushing, Code of Ordinances.
